1. Call to Order

Councillor McManus, Chair presiding, called the Meeting to Order.

2. Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest and the General Nature Thereof

The *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act* requires any member of Council declaring a pecuniary interest and the general nature thereof, where the interest of a member of Council has not been disclosed by reason of the member's absence from the meeting, to disclose the interest at the first open meeting attended by the member of Council and otherwise comply with the *Act*.

Councillor McManus, Chair presiding, advised of the revised order that items would be taken.

4. Report of the Director of Infrastructure and Development Services

4.2 Gemmell and Bell Court No Parking Request (ITS16-020)

Sub-committee discussion: The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services provided an overview on the resident-led request for no parking on Bell Court and Gemmell Court during school hours. Parking on this street during school hours reduces the width of vehicle maneuverability on these streets, but is not an issue during after-school hours. Staff has recommended that the parking restrictions be between 8am - 5pm Monday to Friday.

Matthew Richards advised that he is happy to see the no parking restrictions during school hours, but asked Sub-committee to consider exempting holidays from the new restrictions.

The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services responded to questions from Sub-committee that the schools would be notified of the new no parking by-laws on Gemmell Court and Bell Court. Cars would disburse to nearby streets during drop-off and pick-up hours for the schools. He also clarified that there are currently no parking restrictions on Short Street.

4. Report of the Director of Infrastructure and Development Services

4.1 Animal Control By-law Review Process (ITS16-027)

Sub-committee discussion: The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services provided an overview of the staff management report, explaining that Council requested a report regarding reviewing the Animal Control By-law.

Roundtables on animal control are taking place in other communities, giving municipalities the opportunity to hear from the public about their concerns and opinions on animal control. The recommended roundtable is modelled after the one that the City of Guelph used during their Animal Control review.

The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services outlined the timeline for the Animal Control By-law review, including when the new By-law would be drafted and ready to present to Council.

"Strengthening our Community: Attracting People and Investment"

Sharon Morrice of the Feline Friends Network presented to Sub-committee regarding the overpopulation of cats in Stratford and area, as well as the work that Feline Friend has done over the past 10 years to have cats spayed and neutered to reduce the amount of feral cats. Approximately 1600 cats have been spayed or neutered by Feline Friends Networks since 2006.

Feral cats are outdoor born cats that are not suitable for adoption. Ms. Morrice explained that animals that are adopted from rescues and shelters are fixed before adoption. This is not always the case with the sale of cats in pet stores, which can lead to unwanted litters of kittens that end up back in shelters or on the street.

The average un-spayed female cat has 2 litters of 4 to 6 kittens per year. If 50 un-spayed female cats are sold in a pet store in one year, this can lead to 400 to 600 more kittens during that time period.

Ms. Morrice outlined the main objectives of the Feline Friends Networks to be:

1. To help stop puppy and kitten mills;
2. To help reduce overpopulation.

Feline Friends Network believes that pet stores that sell unsterilized cats and kittens are part of the problem, and that the Canadian Federation of Humane Societies supports the banning of pet sales in stores.

Ms. Morrice presented an online petition regarding banning the sales of pets in Stratford pet stores that has gained over 1000 signatures.

In response to the management report from staff, Feline Friends Networks feels that allowing 3 unaltered cats in each home is too many, as reproduction will lead to many more cats. This would only be suitable if all cats were of the same sex. They also believe that the recommended process for the Animal Control By-law Review is too long, as they feel no new information is going to come forward during this time that hasn't been acknowledged in Stratford over the past 2 years. The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services clarified that the recommended timeline would ideally have a new by-law implemented in April 2017, with

a review of its success after a year.

Sub-committee questioned what percentage of Ontario municipalities has banned the sale of pets in pet stores. Ms. Morrice did not have the exact figures, but knew that more cities were passing limits to the number of pets allowed in each home. She also knew that the cities that had implemented the ban on pet sales in pet stores had seen a reduction in the intake of unwanted pets in their shelters and rescues.

Sub-committee discussed whether pet stores could include the cost of altering animals into their fees charged to customers at the time of pet sales, as is done in shelters.

Pamela Bartlett addressed Sub-committee asking if pet stores were to not accept pets into their stores to sell, what would happen to them. Often the pet store is the last resort for the owner before having the animal euthanized or disposing of them onto the street.

Ken Wood addressed Sub-committee regarding a request made to Stratford City Council in 2012 asking for an Animal Welfare and Control Group to be implemented as an advisory committee to Council. The proposed group would have been made up of 5-6 people with an annual budget of \$1000-\$1500. Council did not approve this committee at that time. Mr. Wood encouraged Council to act on implementing Animal Control By-law changes. Mr. Wood submitted two articles in support of banning pet sales in pet stores to the City Clerk.

Steve Bartlett, owner of Superior Aquariums Inc. in Stratford, addressed Sub-committee and explained that he has not taken cats or kittens into his pet store to sell for the last 14 months. Mr. Bartlett doesn't believe pet stores are the problem, as people will continue to sell pets through Facebook, Kijiji and other methods of social media. He advised that not every person wants a rescued pet, but some want a fresh start with a new puppy or kitten. Mr. Bartlett would like to see the City of Stratford legislate for the protection of pets, but also local businesses such as his pet store. Mr. Bartlett submitted correspondence regarding his kennel to the City Clerk.

Sub-committee discussed both the staff report and presentations made

"Strengthening our Community: Attracting People and Investment"

and agreed that the Animal Control By-law review needed to be done correctly.

Sub-committee would like to see the province, animal control officers, interest groups and the humane society included in the roundtable discussions.

9. Capital Project Update

The Director of Infrastructure and Development Services provided a Capital Projects Update for the month of April 2016, including highlighting the following:

- Romeo Street Pedestrian bridge over the Court Drain restoration should be complete by the end of June;
- The Huron Street Bridge will repair all joints. Fencing has gone up for safety reasons and the area is being monitored as stones have gone missing;
- The O'Loane Watermain extension has been installed, with restoration and trail work ongoing;
- The LED Street light conversion project is complete and the City has noticed a 37% reduction in their energy consumption;
- Bicycle symbols are to be added to McCarthy Road and re-laid on other streets where fading has occurred;
- Ballantyne Avenue Watermain replacement - Failing storm and sanitary sewers have been identified and require completing;
- Fire Chief John Paradis identified that there has been difficulty identifying training properties for the Stratford Fire Department that wouldn't cause firetrucks to block traffic on street. The Fire Chief has found a property on Lorne Ave. that is off the main roads and has 20 foot high berms for the Fire Department to train and not affect the flow of traffic.

Title: Animal Control By-law Review Process

Objective: To consider appointing a round table to conduct an Animal Control By-law review for the City of Stratford.

Background: In 2014 and 2015, concerned citizens and interest groups presented several issues regarding animal control to Stratford City Council. Accordingly, Council has requested that Staff undertake a comprehensive review of Animal Control Bylaw 195-2002.

Issues have been identified as follows:

A) Banning the sale of pets in pet stores:

- Banning the sale of any pets that are not from a reputable shelter or rescue organization to help ensure pets are not acquired from puppy or kitten mills;
- Banning the sale of pets that are not spayed or neutered to help control the unwanted pet population;
- Note that banning the sale of pets in pet stores will require an amendment to the City of Stratford's Business Licencing By-law, not the Animal Control By-law. However, for the purposes of this review, it will be considered with the other animal care and control issues identified by Council and brought forward by citizens as outlined in this report.

B) Limiting the number of pets allowed per household:

- At present, there is no limit to the number of pets per household so long as the animals are spayed or neutered and are properly cared for as per the provisions outlined in the Animal Control By-law;
- Residents may have up to 3 unaltered dogs and 3 unaltered cats per household;
- Many other municipalities limit the number of pets allowed per household, including Brant County, Brockville, London, St. Thomas, Toronto, and others.

C) Licencing:

- Pro-rating dog and cat licensing fees or waiving licensing fees for pets adopted from the Stratford Perth Humane Society (SPHS), thus encouraging residents to adopt rescue animals instead of shopping in pet stores or buying pets from puppy/kitten mills;
- Updating business licencing criteria for Pet Stores;
- Updating licencing requirements for kennels and catteries and/or breeders.

D) Other Issues:

- Limiting the amount of dogs per owner allowed in the off-leash Stratford Dog Park;
- Revisions and/or updates to definitions in the bylaw;
- Updates to the standards of animal care requirements;
- Enforcement issues.

Analysis:

I) BYLAW REVIEW ITEMS

There are currently 2 pet stores in the City of Stratford that sell pets. There is 1 licenced kennel in the City of Stratford and there are no licenced catteries. By-law inspections are carried out by the SPHS on a complaint-basis only (ie – regular inspections are not carried out).

A) ADVOCACY FOR BANNING THE SALE OF PETS IN PET STORES:

- "Feline Friends," a local cat rescue organization, has advocated for a ban on the sale of pets in pet stores. They propose that the only animals available for adoption in pet stores should be from reputable shelters and rescue organizations. The organization has stated that several families have paid \$100

for unspayed/unneutered kittens at local pet stores. Thereafter, they contact Feline Friends for assistance because they cannot afford to have their new pet fixed. They advocate banning the sale of pets in pet stores to help eliminate this issue and encourage more prospective pet owners to adopt their pets from the SPHS, thereby helping a fixed rescue animal find a home and freeing up animal rescue resources while helping to control the pet population through adopting a pet that is already spayed/neutered.

- Canadian Federation of Humane Societies (CFHS) opposes the sale of cats and dogs in markets or pet stores other than satellite adoption centres. The CFHS advocates that companion animal stores restrict their sale of live animals to domesticated and captive-bred birds, fish and small mammals other than cats and dogs. The CFHS believes that the sale of puppies and kittens in pet stores (other than shelter adoption centres) promotes impulse buying and is an outlet for puppy and kitten mill animals. In addition, the environment in a retail store is not appropriate to properly meet the needs of young animals. The CFHS recommends adoption from local rescue organizations and encourages pet stores to host satellite adoptions in partnership with humane societies, the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), and other reputable rescue groups, citing Pet Smart as a successful model.¹
- The Stratford Perth Humane Society advocates the CFHS position statement, and supports the regulation of retail pet sales to ensure that these animals are sourced from reputable, licenced organizations or breeders. The SPHS proposes that municipalities increase regulations on what pet stores are able to sell (i.e. developing stringent standards for a certification program that would actually eliminate irresponsible breeders as sources for pet stores). They advocate that pet stores stop selling dogs and cats from unknown sources (i.e. puppy mills), and instead use their stores to display homeless pets in need of adoption from humane societies, SPCAs and animal rescue groups. They cite PetSmart and Ren's Pet Depot as successful "satellite adoption centres" for animal shelters.
- It is important to note that:
 - The Canadian Kennel Club's Code of Practice prohibits their members from selling the dogs and cats they breed to pet stores. Therefore, pet stores that sell animals often turn to puppy and kitten mills to supply their stores.
 - At present, the Stratford Perth Humane Society's pet adoption fees are \$200 for cats and \$300 for dogs. All animals adopted at the SPHS are spayed or neutered, receive a veterinary health exam, their first

vaccinations, and they are dewormed and microchipped, a total value of \$530 for cats and \$580 for dogs.²

- Studies have shown that 9% of cats and 10% of dogs are acquired through pet stores. Thus the vast majority come from other sources. However, it is not known what percentage of the animals surrendered to animal rescues come from pet stores.
- While some residents are likely involved in “backyard breeding,” it is unlikely that there are puppy/kitten mills operating within municipal boundaries. Therefore, the City of Stratford has no jurisdiction over puppy/kitten mills that may be operating in neighboring municipalities.

B) BEST PRACTICES:

i) Current Municipal Pet Store Sale Bans

At present, the Cities of Ottawa, Brampton, and Guelph are currently debating banning the sale of non-rescue pets in pet stores. Since 2011, the cities of Toronto, Mississauga, Kingston, Pickering, Oshawa, Vaughan, and Waterloo have all banned the sale of non-rescue pets in pet stores. These municipalities have all chosen to ban the sale of non-rescue pets in pet stores to encourage residents to adopt rescue animals, to help control the pet population by only adopting out pets that have been spayed/neutered, and to help ensure that pets are not acquired from inhumane puppy or kitten mills.

ii) Staff Recommendations

It is important to note that City Staff in both Toronto and Mississauga did not recommend implementing a ban on the sale of pets in pet stores. Instead, they recommended increasing restrictions and licencing regulations, and increasing monitoring and enforcement.

The Toronto staff report stated:

“Banning the sale of cats and dogs in the City of Toronto will not significantly address issues such as reducing the number of unwanted pets in Toronto, reducing the feral cat population, reducing impulse purchases, or decreasing the supply and demand for animals supplied by puppy mills. Municipal Licencing and Standards staff did not find evidence in literature reviews, questionnaire responses or inspections of pet shops to support the concerns cited in various submissions made to the Licencing and Standards Committee.”

Similarly, the Mississauga staff report stated:

"Staff do not support banning the sale of cats and dogs from licenced pet shops as it is not warranted based on the history of complaints received, recent inspections by Animal Services staff and the impact it would have on the two licenced pet shops that sell cats and dogs for profit.

In staff's view, the most effective manner to ensure that cats and dogs sold by licenced pet shops are being properly cared for and in compliance with applicable provisions of the Business By-law and the Animal Care and Control By-law is to move from complaint-based enforcement to quarterly proactive inspections of licenced pet shops that sell cats and/or dogs."

iii) Impact

Further research is needed on the effect this ban has had (ie – on rescue intakes and rescue adoptions), how the ban has been regulated, and whether or not these municipalities have encountered difficulties with enforcement.

The City of Toronto helped implement this new regulation by creating public awareness and encouraging the public to report animal abuse and the existence of puppy/kitten mills, along with encouraging the public to take appropriate action regarding pet shops found to have obtained cats and dogs from an unspecified/unlicensed source. However, the City of Toronto has noted that it is not currently possible to determine how effective the banning of pet sales has been, as cats and dogs are still widely available on the internet and can also be purchased at pet stores in neighboring municipalities. Similarly, the City of Mississauga noted that pet stores that had been surveyed in advance of the ban noted that internet pet sales had already resulted in a significant decrease to the sale of pets in their stores.

However, the City of Toronto considered an amendment to the original regulation to assist with enforcement and to clarify the intent of the regulation. The regulation adopted in 2011 reads as follows:

"Every retailer, including any person or business that sells more than 10 dogs per year, must obtain animals from one or the following sources only:

- A) Municipal animal shelters;
- B) Registered humane societies;
- C) Registered shelters or rescue groups;
- D) From people who have surrendered their pets to them at no charge."

However, allowing pet stores to sell animals that had been surrendered to them at no charge may unintentionally allow pet shops to acquire pets for sale from home breeders or puppy/kitten mills. In 2013, an amendment to the regulation was recommended as follows:

"Every pet shop must obtain animals from only the following sources:

- A) Municipal animal shelters;
- B) Registered humane societies;
- C) Registered shelters; or
- D) Rescue groups"

However, these changes were not adopted.

iv) Alternatives to banning the sale of pets in pet stores

- Retain current pet sales and increase regulations:
 - Possible increases to monitoring pet stores (ie – quarterly) to ensure the sale of animals complies with the standards of care provisions outlined in the Animal Control Bylaw.
 - However, it is not known whether the SPHS has the resources to initiate a rigorous regulation program.
- Register of Pet Sale information:
 - Possible expansion of current animal sale regulations to include new regulations for the sale of pets in pet stores, requiring a pet store to maintain a register in which the following information is recorded:
 - Date of purchase
 - Full description of the animal
 - Name, address and a description of the person from whom the animal was acquired;
 - A requirement that every pet store provide a receipt for each animal purchased that contains the following information:
 - Date of sale
 - Price of sale
 - Breed or cross breed
 - Sex of the animal
 - Age of the animal
 - Description of the animal (colour, markings)
 - An up-to-date certificate of health from a veterinarian for any dog, cat, or rabbit
- Adding additional requirements to the kennel/cattery provisions in the Animal Control By-law, such as including a licencing requirement for rabbit breeders.
- Initiating a public education campaign aimed at informing the general public as to what constitutes illegal breeding and the reasons for municipal regulation of these activities.

II) PROPOSED BYLAW REVIEW PROCESS

The issues associated with animal care and control are many and varied, and all are interconnected. As noted above, several municipalities have recently evaluated the implications of banning the sale of pets in pet stores. The majority of these municipalities have focused on this question exclusively and have not examined other issues. Many conducted public surveys and held public meetings to receive feedback on this issue; however, an extensive public review process was not initiated by any of these municipalities with the exception of the City of Guelph.

The City of Guelph is in the process of conducting an extensive animal control by-law review through a public round table. Guelph initiated the public process because they were asked to review several contentious and interconnected issues with respect to animal care and control, similar to what the City of Stratford has been asked to review. Issues considered in the Guelph review include the sale of animals in pet stores, the number of pets per household, licencing and enforcement issues, and cats roaming at large.

To address these issues, the City of Guelph assembled a 25-person round table comprised of:

- 7 City Staff members, including by-law enforcement, the police department, and the clerks department;
- 7 representatives from relevant local organizations, including local pet stores, the kennel club, law firms, and a policy planner from the Government of Ontario;
- 6 experts in the field of animal care and control, including the OSPCA, the Humane Society, and the Ontario Veterinary College;
- 5 members of the community at large, elected through a ballot application process.

The round table has been conducting ongoing quarterly meetings for the past two years, and a public survey was conducted between November and December of 2015. All feedback and research will be included in a report with the new draft by-law for Council's consideration in September 2016. City of Guelph staff report that they have had very positive results through this round table process, as it offered an opportunity to consider the expertise needed to resolve these issues and to hear public feedback throughout the process. It also brought the enforceability of several issues to light in a way that might not have been obvious through a less rigorous consultation process. For details on the process, please see the attached infographic and terms of reference from the City of Guelph.

As noted above, there are several animal care and control issues identified by Council and residents pursuant to this by-law review that should be thoroughly researched and considered with adequate public and expert consultation. Staff feel that conducting a public round table process based on the Guelph model would address these issues

thoroughly and fairly and help Council make a more informed decision on the future of animal care and control and in the City of Stratford.

While a public round table process should be initiated, it is hoped that it will not have to be as lengthy as the process undertaken in the City of Guelph, as best practice research is now more readily available, as more municipalities have reviewed the pet store sale question and the City of Guelph has created a successful model for us to follow. Furthermore, residents have already provided Council with a petition and several letters, along with extensive research and recommendations on existing by-laws and policies. Therefore, Staff propose the following objectives and timeline:

III) REGULATORY MECHANISMS

A) THE OSPCA ACT

The Ontario Government regulates general animal welfare issues through the Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act. The Act establishes basic standards of care for animals, and includes prohibitions regarding causing distress or harm to animals. The Act also allows inspectors or agents of the OSPCA to enter or inspect any place animals are sold, (with or without a warrant), including a pet store, to assess compliance with the Act. Regulation 60/09 under the Act outlines the basic standards of care for animals, including that every animal must be provided with:

1. Adequate food and water
2. Appropriate medical attention
3. Sanitary conditions
4. Ventilation
5. Light
6. Protection from the elements, including harmful temperatures

The regulation also discusses requirements for animals confined to pens or other enclosed structures.

B) THE MUNICIPAL ACT 2001

Section 151 of the Municipal Act grants municipalities the authority to license and regulate various businesses, including pet stores. Pet stores in Stratford that sell live animals are regulated by the City's Business Licensing By-Law.

Financial Impact: Unknown at this time.

Staff Recommendation: That the City of Stratford initiate a public round table to review the Animal Control issues identified by Council and the public, to be completed by early 2017.

A round table is a space for the city to collaborate with the community to design better services and policy. Here's an example of a round table process used when the City created a by-law and wanted to hear what the community thought about it.



Animal Control Bylaw Review Working Group Draft Terms of Reference

The City of Guelph (City) has initiated a review of its Animal Control Bylaw. These Bylaws have been in place for a number of years and have undergone various amendments. The City recognizes these by-laws may no longer reflect all community concerns regarding domestic animals, exotic animals, poultry and wildlife. As part of the review process, the City will establish an Animal Control Working Group (ACWG).

The purpose of this document is to provide potential members of the ACWG with an understanding of their role and responsibilities as members, expected level of commitment, rules of order, and the process to amend this Terms of Reference.

ACWG Mandate

The City believes communicating with local residents and community leaders is important. The ACWG will provide a forum for consultation, review and exchange of information regarding the City's Animal Control Bylaws.

As with all City working groups, the ACWG will not have the authority to commit City resources or direct the work of staff. As stated above, the ACWG is a forum for information dissemination and gathering of feedback from stakeholders to create possible recommendations regarding Bylaw amendments or a new Animal Control Bylaw and staff practices relating to Animal Control within the City of Guelph.

ACWG Membership

The composition of the ACWG will provide a balance of perspectives from local community members and specific stakeholders including:

1. Residents within the City of Guelph (maximum 5 participants)
2. Guelph Humane Society
3. Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals
4. Ontario Veterinary College
5. Local Pet Stores
6. Canadian Kennel Club
7. Local Animal Daycares
8. Environmental Advisory Committee
9. River Systems Advisory Committee
10. Guelph Police Service
11. Bylaw Compliance staff
12. Building Services staff
13. Parks and Open spaces staff
14. Environmental Planning staff
15. Guelph Health Unit
16. CanHerp

- 17. Communications
- 18. Employee Engagement
- 19. Animal Rescue

ACWG members will not be limited to residents, property owners, businesses etc. from within the boundaries of the City of Guelph. Where appropriate, stakeholders from outside the City boundaries will be eligible for membership in the ACWG.

City staff not listed above, including City Councilors are not eligible for membership on the ACWG. If necessary other City staff and/or their consultants will be available as resources at all meetings.

Meeting attendance is very important, as such, if a stakeholder misses three consecutive meetings, the appointee will be deemed to have forfeited their position on the ACWG, subject to the appointee having the opportunity to address the ACWG in writing regarding their absenteeism. The ACWG will then vote on their continued participation.

The formation process includes the following key steps:

- Advertisement of the ACWG opportunity
- Formal request to voluntarily participate on the ACWG can be provided in writing to either of the project team members listed below by letter or email with return contact information (home address, phone number and email address)
- Attendance at the first meeting is mandatory
- Membership of ACWG will be confirmed at the first ACWG meeting
- The group will consist of up to 20 members
- Depending on the number of participation requests received, a random selection process may be implemented
- The City's project team will have the final word
- The first ACWG meeting date will be provided to volunteers in advance of the meeting

Members of the ACWG will be required to participate for the duration of the Bylaw review. Based on similar projects, we anticipate the duration of this review will last until July of 2014.

Roles and Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of all ACWG members to participate in discussions, provide input and ideas and listen to other points of view. Additional responsibilities are as follows:

City staff (Bylaw Compliance)

- Organize, attend and chair ACWG meetings and participate in discussions
- Keep ACWG members informed of project activities
- Listen to the opinions and perspectives expressed
- Provide timely responses and/or action as appropriate including follow-up on issues raised that could not be addressed at meetings
- Provide staff to maintain the effective functioning of the committee including administrative functions e.g. development and distribution of agendas, meeting notes
- Provide research and design options to each meeting

ACWG Members

- Attend ACWG meetings and participate in discussions.
- Be informed about the City's Animal Control Bylaws and animal concerns within Guelph.
- Review materials provided in advance of the meetings
- Where applicable relay or receive information to and from the broader community or the ACWG members' associated stakeholder group.
- Provide a community or stakeholder perspective on discussion topics
- Help the ACWG operate effectively by contributing constructively and openly discussing ideas and opportunities

ACWG Meeting Schedule and Format

The ACWG will form once the City has reviewed the submissions and selected the committee participants.

Within the first month of establishing the ACWG, meetings will be held once per month. All meetings will be held at Guelph City Hall, 1 Carden Street.

We anticipate conducting approximately 6 to 8 meetings between February 2014 and July 2014, meetings will occur during business hours, (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Meetings will last approximately three hours.

In addition to ACWG meetings, a minimum of two community engagement meetings (7 to 9p.m.) will be held to provide information to the community at large.

The first meeting will focus on the role of the ACWG and provide members with a basic understanding of the City's Animal Control Bylaws and the concerns received to date with respect to domestic animals, poultry and wildlife within Guelph.

Standard meeting agenda items will include:

- Project update
- Discussion of ACWG comments and concerns
- Possible Bylaw amendments or sections
- Review of issues and concerns
- Other agenda items as appropriate

Meeting materials including an agenda and meeting notes will be emailed to the ACWG members at least 72 hours prior to the next meeting.

Rules of Order

Members of the ACWG must conduct themselves in an impartial and objective manner. It is understood that members of the ACWG will perform their duties in such a way as to promote public confidence and trust in the integrity, objectivity and impartiality of the ACWG. The meeting Chair will have the right and responsibility to control proceedings of the ACWG, including the right to exclude any member of the public or any member of the ACWG who is interfering with or disrupting the ACWG proceedings.

Every person, idea and concern has equal worth. It will be expected that the members of the ACWG be respectful of others.

Final Word

The goal of the ACWG is to achieve the following:

- To share an understanding of the animal control issues and challenges currently faced by the local community.
- To work with the community to develop and recommend changes to the City's Animal Control Bylaws for Council's consideration.

On April 23, 2012, Larry Baswick made a powerpoint presentation to our City Council asking that Council consider setting up a new committee called the Animal Welfare and Control Committee with representatives from groups in Stratford who are concerned with the welfare of both domestic and wild creatures. These groups, such as the OSPCA, FFN, the Stratford Naturalists, the Dog Park Association, etc could work together, discuss current issues related to their mandate and make recommendations to City Council for action. Larry explained that other cities such as London, Calgary and Windsor have successfully created such committees. We will keep you informed. Thanks to the dozen or so FFN members who attended the Council meeting to show support for Larry and his team of Cheryl Simpson and Carole Huband.

Calgary councillors could revisit ban on retail pet sales, Toronto touts success of such a move

City councillors raised their hackles Tuesday as it appeared they could soon be involved in another hairy debate on the merits of banning retail pet sales.

On Monday, Metro spoke to a number of animal advocates and rescue groups who've taken to social media to criticize the yet-to-open The Top Dog Store.

Owned by Marion and Robert Church, the same couple that previously ran Calgary's only remaining dog kennel out of the now closed Market Mall Petland, Top Dog will offer an expanded kennel services and all the necessary accessories.

It appeared that Calgary city council would debate a ban on the retail sales of cats and dogs in 2012, but that never materialized.

Ward 11 Coun. Brian Pincott voiced support for the ban at the time and said Tuesday he would be willing to reintroduce the topic at city hall, should it come to that.

"The puppy-mill industry, which we know is horrible, is there to support and supply the pet store demand," Pincott said. "If we don't have cats and dogs sold through pet stores, then people get them through reputable breeders or through the adoption process. And we have so many, so many cats and dogs that need good, forever homes."

Robert Church said Monday, however, his store would only support "reliable, ethical breeders," and his model received support from Coun. Sean Chu, whose ward includes Top Dog.

"People are still going to sell dogs," he said. "If we don't allow it legally, people are going to do it illegally. No matter what it's going to happen, just like drugs."

Chu said he would support a certification process for retail pet sellers, one that would subject such stores to an annual inspection by city bylaw officers.

"That will calm a lot of people — what happened is a few bad-apple (owners) have tainted the whole bucket," he explained.

The City of Toronto adopted a ban on retail sales of cats and dogs in 2011.

Mary Lou Leiher, a program manager with the animal services division in Canada's most populous city said the move has been credited in part for a drop in animals being turned in to city-run shelters in recent years.

"There were some people (store owners) who weren't happy with it, but we did reach out to them so they could have animals for adoption in their stores — animals in our shelter, for example," Leiher said. "It helps them to promote the other products that they're selling. When people get a new pet, then they need to get food and they need to get supplies, all those kinds of things. This gave them a chance to almost do a community service or sorts . . . they adopted them out on our behalf. These were animals that were already homeless and they are fully spayed and neutered and vaccinated and checked by a vet."

Dear City Council:

We run our dog kennel responsibly and we are held accountable to the OSPCA, The Humane Society, our veterinarian, our customers' veterinarians, all the applicable departments of the City of Stratford in conjunction with the Perth Health Unit, the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC), the Ontario Kennel Code of Practice, and our insurance company. We obey all laws and are doing nothing illegal, or unethical.

Our kennel license is specific to the Municipality of Stratford and I believe that our kennel is the most regulated and monitored dog kennel in Ontario.

Our kennel should be considered a good example of business, government, and law enforcement agencies working together to create a set of standards that reasonable citizens can approve of. Stratford City Council should not expose us to the extreme demands and opinions of special interest groups and people who will never be satisfied and never can be satisfied short of us closing our doors. These special interest groups consider all dog breeders as inhumane, untrustworthy, evil liars. They also accuse the OSPCA, The Humane Society, and municipal officials of intentionally not doing their jobs. They go so far as to say the OSPCA takes kickbacks. All of this is stated on their social media. These groups blindly attacking all dog kennels are comparable to the groups and individuals who blindly attack all government officials, or all lawyers, calling them all corrupt and liars because of a few bad apples. None of these special interest groups can be convinced otherwise.

Our kennel is only 3 years old, but the process of designing it has taken many years. We began by asking the City of Stratford if it would allow us to have a breeding dog kennel. The City of Stratford said yes, provided the OSPCA and the Humane Society would work with us and formally recommend that the City issue us the license, which they did.

We began the construction of our kennel only after all of the kennel rules and regulations were in place. The City of Stratford has the most vigorous rules of any jurisdiction in Ontario to my knowledge. Our property was already zoned for a kennel in the Official Plan. We canvassed all the neighbours and no one had an objection. Two of our neighbours came to the public planning meeting to support our kennel.

A city by-law officer inspected our building and the kennel construction was designed with the input of the City, the OSPCA, including their manager from the Kitchener office, the Humane Society; 2 veterinarians, Royal Canin veterinary and kennel planner from France, and ourselves. This is all documented.

We have always maintained that we wanted to build the best kennel in Ontario and while the OSPCA said that was a high target, they agreed it is a good target.

1. **The dog kennel regulations we adhere to are specific to the municipality of Stratford and these regulations exceed all Ontario rules and guidelines.**

- The number of dogs housed in our kennel and the size of our dog breeds was all pre-determined before we built the kennel.
- Our kennel is controlled as to the number of litters per dog.
- The OSPCA monitors our retirement program. We submit documents.
- Our dogs are housetrained. This is part of our license requirement.
- We feed an excellent food, which we supplement daily with boiled eggs, smoked bones, biscuits and chews, and weekly with real chicken and rice that I make.
- We have gas heat and air conditioning.
- We are very well lighted.
- We are very well ventilated.
- Our building is divided into different rooms – based on the needs of whelping mothers, young pups, young dogs being raised as breeding animals, and breeding animals.
- We have large pens.
- We have very large exercise areas and each dog has exercise time every day.
- We are regulated and inspected by the City of Stratford fire department. We exceed the necessary number of fire extinguishers, carbon monoxide and smoke detectors.
- All of these requirements are met by us and they are monitored by the OSPCA.

2. Proper paperwork and transparency is key to our kennel license. We are subject to the following conditions.

- We have always been open to the OSPCA on an unannounced 24/7 basis. We have never received written orders and we have never been charged with anything.
- We are also subject to unannounced visits by the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC).
- The OSPCA maintains a list of all our breeding animals which includes their CKC registration number and their microchip number.
- We are subject to providing the OSPCA with all litter information.
- We are subject to providing the OSPCA written documented proof of our animals when they are retired including who their new owner is (we also spay or neuter on retirement).
- If our veterinarian recommends euthanizing a particular animal, we provide the OSPCA with a veterinarian certificate explaining the circumstances.
- We maintain records on each animal for vaccines, health checks and medical procedures, dentistry, and routine grooming.
- Our veterinarian visits our kennel every week and inspects every animal.
- Our veterinarian reviews all breeding dogs every 6 months to make sure their health remains suitable for breeding.
- This is all documented.

3. Our dogs are our pets.

- Our kennel is not a sideline at a farm or a hobby for someone with another full time job.
- It is our full time living as well as that of our employees.
- The kennel is well staffed, with people who love dogs.
- We care for our dogs. No dog ever loses out due to finances.
- We let them play and we play with them.
- They have toys and socialize with other kennel dogs in the kennel.

We have just received permission to install (removable) runs in our backyard and we intend to do a good job.

Animal welfare special interest groups are not accountable to anyone. They can say whatever they want, wherever they want, about anyone they want, including social media, without accountability. It does not matter whether it is true or not. It is out there forever and anyone's reputation can be destroyed overnight.

All reasonable people know employees of the City of Stratford and the employees of the OSPCA follow the rules and do their jobs. This is how it should be. We have earned their trust through transparency, honesty, and a lot of hard work.

Dogs are our passion. We chose this business because we enjoy it.

Stop the sale of pets in Stratford's pet stores!

Currently, it is legal for pet stores in Stratford, Ontario to sell animals – including cats and kittens – that are un-spayed and un-neutered, making pet stores yet another source of unaltered cats that contribute to the problem of over-population that Feline Friends Network (FFN) and other local rescue organizations are working to control.

Not all local pet stores sell animals – and we applaud the businesses who help find adoptive homes for spayed / neutered cats and kittens from rescues and shelters – but the ones that do benefit financially (the current cost of a kitten is in the \$100 range) while accepting none of the responsibility for their actions.

FFN sees the effects of pet sales frequently, with calls from people who have purchased kittens at a local pet store but are unable to afford to have their new pet spayed or neutered. If the pet owners qualify as low income, FFN will cover the cost of the surgery.

While we are very happy that some pet store kittens are being spayed/neutered through our Low Income program, it does impact our budget, 100% of which comes from donations and fundraising efforts. And not everyone qualifies for our low income program and the other impact is on the animals and the community. When new pet owners don't spay or neuter their kittens, these cats can potentially go on to have generations of litters that may end up at the shelter, in the foster homes of local rescues, or out on the streets.






"Not all pet stores sell dogs from puppy mills, but animal protection groups estimate that **90 per cent** of dogs sold in pet stores come from puppy mills."

Even if pet store owners have the best of intentions, there is every chance that they don't know the circumstances around the living conditions and origins of every single puppy and kitten that they buy and sell, and those of the animals kept for breeding purposes.

Since society has created this crisis, we must work toward solutions.


Pet stores that sell unsterilized cats and kittens are part of the problem, not the solution.

Spaying and neutering is the only humane solution that has been shown to control / reduce animal populations. Sterilization at the appropriate age recommended by veterinarians has proven health benefits (eg. female cats that are spayed are far less likely to get reproductive cancers). Nuisance behaviours are also reduced by spaying and neutering (eg. fighting, heat cycles, and spraying). Pet stores often sell animals that are too young to be spayed or neutered.

9% of cats & 10% of dogs come from pet stores

– City of Toronto | Staff report for action on Banning the Sale of Cats and Dogs in Pet Shops | May 2011

Cats reproduce at incredibly high rates. Cats leaving pet stores unsterilized may be ‘only’ 9% of the supply, **but they may easily contribute much more than 9% of the overpopulation problem.** Reputable shelters and rescues spay and neuter cats before adoption.



CAT MATH

If a pet store sells 50 un-spayed female cats in 1 year,
and each female has 2 litters of 4 to 6 kittens (8 to 12 kittens each) *

= 400 to 600 more kittens in 1 year

+ exponential numbers as their offspring breed + uncontrolled breeding in future years

* This is a very conservative estimate. The Canadian Federation of Humane Societies states that 1 un-spayed female cat can result in 25 kittens born in a year. – *CFHS Animal Shelter Statistics, 2014*



the overpopulation problem

According to Canadian Federation of Humane Societies' 2014 Animal Shelter Statistics, **over 163,000 cats and 73,000 dogs were taken in by shelters in Canada in 2014. Of those 27% (44,010) cats and 11% (8,030) dogs were euthanized.***

Overpopulation can be expensive to a community due to excessive costs of impounding and sheltering unwanted animals, extensive spending by local governments responding to animal complaints such as dog bites and other nuisances, and public health and safety risks.

“We have a moral obligation to end the overpopulation crisis in order to reduce the number of unwanted homeless dogs and cats. When people buy animals from breeders and pet stores instead of adopting from animal shelters, they deny a needy animal a chance at a good home. As long as people support a market that treats dogs and cats as profit-generating commodities, we will struggle with the overpopulation crisis.” – *Lisa Towell, Myths About Pet Stores and Breeders, 2013*

** Estimate calculated based on figures reported by 89 shelters – a survey response rate of 52% of the 168 humane societies and SPCAs located across Canada.*



feline friends network

FFN works to reduce the local cat population humanely, through spay & neuter programs. We currently cover the entire cost of sterilizing cats belonging to low-income residents of Stratford. We also trap, neuter & return feral / community cats to managed colonies.

Feral / community cats are cats living outdoors in our community – they don't have homes and they aren't socialized to people. **They are the offspring of abandoned pets.** Feline Friends is the only local organization that spays and neuters feral / community cats.

help us succeed

For all of the animals rescued, spayed & neutered by animal welfare organizations and volunteers in Stratford, we're only scratching the surface. The shelter is beyond capacity, and is moving to a new facility, to accommodate more homeless animals (mainly cats). Paws of Perth's foster homes are continuously full, and they look for more foster homes. There is not always space for cats in need. Feline Friends gets calls daily from people who need financial help to sterilize and vaccinate their cats (**some of whom have bought unsterilized kittens from local pet stores**). We also get many calls from people feeding stray cats in their yards, and from people who's barn cat populations have gotten out of control (some of those barn cats were 'dumped' in the country by their former city owners).

We all need the support of our City Council to help us get ahead of this problem, and regulating pet sales in Stratford stores will make a difference.



successful models

Feed-All Pet Centre is a Stratford pet store that has significantly contributed to helping shelter cats find homes through their Adopt-a-Cat program. For over six years, they have housed cats from the local SPHS in their spacious cat cage (with ceiling-height catwalk). **Approximately 330 cats have been adopted through the Feed-All store.** They take only the harder-to-adopt (due to age, special requirements etc.) cats... not kittens. The staff cares for the cats until they are adopted, and the longest any cat has been there is six weeks. Feed-All donates the food and supplies, and customers donate toys and blankets that go with the cats to their new homes. One volunteer hand-knits a special blanket for each cat. Adoption fees go to the SPHS.

Since **Pet Valu** opened in Stratford, they have done in-store adoptions of cats from the SPHS. **In 2014, 23 cats and in 2015, approximately 20 cats were adopted through this partnership.**

Since 2013, **Global Pet Foods** has hosted monthly cat adoption events for Paws of Perth County.

Canadians spent \$6.6-billion on their pets in 2014, and the figure is expected to grow to \$8.3 billion a year by 2018 (*CBC News, March 2014*). There is a lot of money in pet food, treats, health & wellness products, clothing, toys, pet furniture, bedding, in-store grooming services, and other amenities pet owners want. **Pet stores don't need to sell 'livestock' in order to thrive.**

why is this a municipal issue?



“A municipality banning the sale of companion animals in pet stores is still a quick, effective, and important step to take. Consider, for example, the City of Richmond, which found upwards of 90 pet store dogs per year were surrendered to the city-run shelter for various reasons – and Richmond only has three stores that actually sells pets (until April 2011, that is). It is not only a burden upon the shelters who care for and re-home these animals, but also the municipality and its taxpayers who pay for the shelter services. Not to mention that a municipal solution is going to be the most effective, as it is more easily implemented... it is the individual cities who regulate businesses with their respective by-laws. And finally, while the province may regulate breeders within its borders, pet stores still often obtain dogs and cats from out-of-province, and even out-of-country, sources. Instead, a city by-law amendment covers all these bases.”

pros & cons of regulating pet sales in stratford

PROS

- 1 | To show leadership in animal welfare, by sending a strong message that Stratford stands for the thoughtful acquisition of pets and is working with its animal welfare community to reduce animal overpopulation, homelessness and suffering.
- 2 | Reducing the City's animal population, as animals currently sold in pet stores are unsterilized.
- 3 | To indirectly shut down puppy and kitten mills by reducing the demand for a supply of cats and dogs.
- 4 | To encourage pet owners to spay & neuter their animals, by stopping pet stores from being an easy means of 'getting rid of' unwanted litters.
- 5 | To reduce impulse buying of pets, which results in an increase of unwanted animals in shelters, rescues, humane societies, on city streets, and dumped in rural areas.
- 6 | To encourage more people to adopt rescue / shelter animals.
- 7 | To help promote the humane treatment of cats and dogs.
- 8 | To increased health assessments by veterinarians leading to a reduction of sick animals running at large or surrendered to animal shelters.

CONS

- 1 | Reduction to the income of the two city businesses that currently sell domestic animals .
- 2 | Bylaw would require enforcement by the City of Stratford and/or Animal Control Officers.



the right decision

Feline Friends Network of Stratford believes that regulating the sale of pets in pet stores is the right decision for our community. On its own, it will not eliminate the problem of pet overpopulation and homelessness. It won't eliminate the existence of all puppy and kitten mill operations. It won't stop people from acquiring pets from other sources, such as on the internet. But that doesn't mean that Stratford shouldn't act. We're urged to think globally and act locally, and regulating pet sales in local stores can have an important positive impact. This is a grassroots issue that needs leadership at the municipal level. We urge Stratford City Council to join Richmond, BC (2010), Toronto (2011), Rosemont-La Petite Patrie, QC (2011), Mississauga (2012), New Westminster, BC (2012), Kingston (2013), Waterloo (2014), Vaughan (2014), Hudson, QC (2014), Mount Royal, QC (2015), Beaconsfield, QC (2015), Ottawa (2016), at least 107 municipalities in the U.S., and others internationally (eg. Istanbul, 2013) in regulating pet sales in pet stores.
